Many of our grower and producer partnerships have been established for several decades built on trust and confidence to enable a smooth continuation of supply.

Striving to reduce plastic packaging

The directors and management are committed to minimising the environmental impact of the materials and resources we use and supporting the well being of employees within the supply chain.

Our packing factory in Braintree, George Harker, has undergone modernisation in recent years culminating in a replacement insulated roof, LED lighting and double glazed windows. Combined these structural changes have reduced our fuel consumption and related carbon emissions, whilst improving the work environment for our employees.

In conjunction with our packaging suppliers and modern manufacturing techniques we are striving to reduce the use of plastic in all our films and can offer recyclable options to our customers.

Although we pride ourselves on our global procurement, we can also look closer to home, and where viable endeavour to source British grown crops including quinoa, peas and spelt.

Our business is registered on Sedex and we encourage our suppliers across the world to join the organisation to monitor and ultimately improve working conditions for the labour force. Supplier visits enable us to engage with local workers and encourage examples of good welfare.



Packing, sorting and mixing services

Our BRC accredited and Organic approved packing factory undertakes packing for major supermarkets, wholesalers and manufacturers. We have an excellent working relationship with some of the best loved food companies in the UK.

Our packing factory has six packing lines and two fruit washing lines. We have the capability to mix, repack and chop dried fruits. We also have facilities for hand packing. This enables us to pack a diverse range of sizes and designs to cater for a wide variety of customers.

We have full traceability from importing the product through to packing and distribution. Every product is quality checked, packed and supplied to specification.

We also work in partnership with importers and manufacturers from initial production, development and art work through to packing and distribution of the products.

We work closely with our customers to ensure every part of the process from sourcing to delivery meets their requirements.



Our George Harker factory gives us the flexibility to carry out bespoke packing.



Washing. We are able to re-clean dried fruit using Burgess fruit washers which wash the fruit with potable water and remove debris and stones. The fruit is then visually inspected to remove any further stalks and foreign matter, so that the final product conforms to the customer's specification.



Mixing. We have the ability to blend different types of fruit using our washing process. However, if the fruit does not need to be washed, it can be mixed on vibrating tables. We also mix pulses and freeze dried products for cereal and manufacturing customers.



Chopping. We can chop a variety of dried fruits, and apply rice flour if required to keep the fruit free flowing, using an Urschel chopping machine. We also visually inspect product and remove foreign material by hand if required.



Storage. We have the capability to unload and palletise containers and can store approximately 300 pallets in our warehouse. We have approximately 15,000 square foot for storage, and although we are a nut free site, have allergen and organic segregation for both raw material and packed product.

1944 Dennis Ciclitira as a member of SOE participates in the famous wartime exploit capturing the German General in charge of occupied Crete.

1957 Demos Ciclitira is incorporated as a Ltd company by Dennis and John Ciclitira importing on a much larger scale from all over the world.

1958 Stanley Stephenson's son, Patrick, joins George Harker.

1970 George Harker relocates to Park Drive, Braintree to new purpose built factory.

1969 Derek Thomas joins Demos and continues to work with the company as the longest serving member of staff.

1988 Demos builds its own offices at Capitol House, Leman Street, London.

1987 Andrew Ciclitira joins Demos working with John and Dennis. The company expands selling direct to supermarkets and manufacturers.

1994 George Harker sold to S&B Foods and Sunmaid raisins. Stanley and Patrick Stephenson retire.

1998 S&B sell George Harker to Demos. S&B continue to trade with Harker.

The Demos/George Harker story

David Ciclitira is the third generation of his family to run the dried fruit business of Demos Ciclitira Ltd. The firm was established in the 1920's by David's grandfather Demos. It then continued under the direction of Demos' two sons John and Dennis.

George Harker moved to London from Yorkshire in the 1820's and established a business importing and distributing "colonial produce". The firm prospered and moved to a large warehouse and offices in Upper Thames Street in the City of London. George Harker passed the business to his son George Junior and then to his son Henry Harker.

The firm came to specialise in dried fruits, cereals and pulses supplied to

grocers throughout the country.

The original offices of Demos Ciclitira were in Monument Street and then Idol Lane, which by chance are a stone's throw from Upper Thames Street. In the 1960's Demos moved to Creechurch Lane in the City and Harker took offices just two doors away at Cree House.

When the Stephenson family took the decision to sell the business of George Harker, the then Chairman Stanley Stephenson had been with the firm for more than eighty years!

The business was purchased in 1994 by Stevens and Brotherton and the famous US raisin company Sunmaid. The venture was short lived

and in 1998, Andrew Ciclitira was responsible for bringing the two old firms of Demos and George Harker together.

Both Companies share a unique heritage and today's business remains true to the spirit and tradition of the generations that have gone before.

The present company maintains its established link with the City through its offices at Capitol House in Leman Street. The Harker factory and warehouse relocated to Braintree, Essex in 1970 and are today the busy heart of the business.

Vine fruits, nature's delicious sweetener

Raisins, currants and sultanas have been hugely important culinary staples in food worldwide for hundreds of years. Demos are renowned for importing, packing and supplying the very best fruit from Greece since 1890 and later from Turkey, South Africa, California and Australia.



Greek Currants

Back in 1890 when Theodore Ciclitira first established Ciclitira & Co, Greek currants were imported and sold in the UK. Over 130 years later, Demos continue to import the best currant crops from Greek growers whom have been growing and drying the fruit for generations. Demos supply Greek provincial currants, (small, medium and blended) and Greek Vostizza, (small, medium and blended).

Turkish Vine Fruit

Turkey are the oldest and world's largest producer of sultana raisins, which are renowned for their high sugar content due to perfect growing conditions. Demos supply Turkish Thompson seedless raisins as well as Turkish No 9 and No 10 Sultanas.

South African Vine Fruit

Mainly grown in The Northern Cape, these vine fruits are known for their bright colour and less sweet flavour which makes them great for snacking. Demos supply South African currants and golden raisins.

Californian Raisins

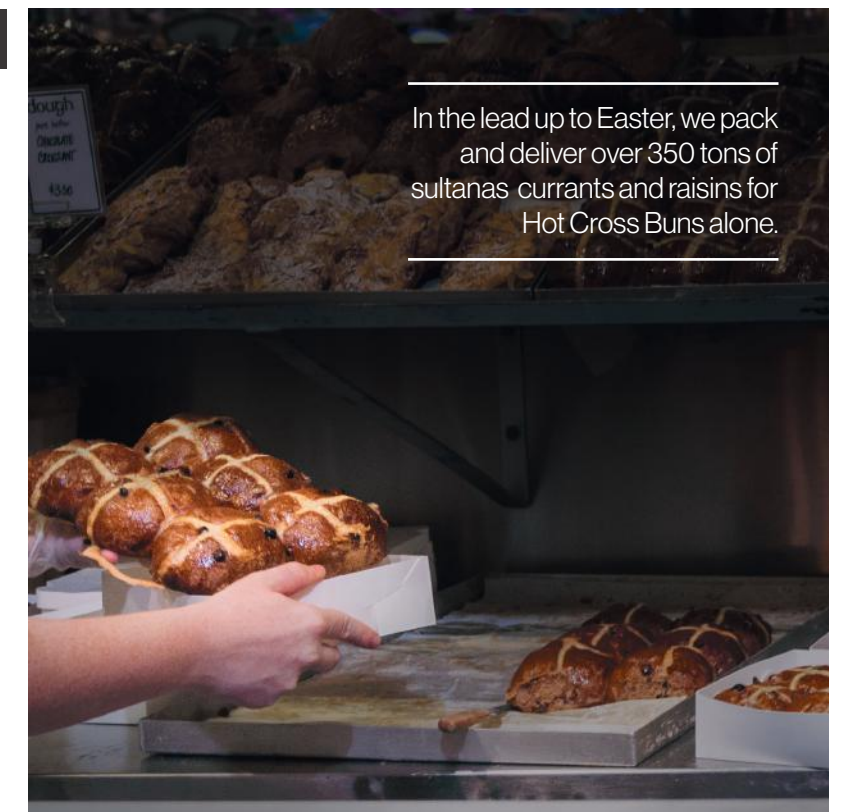
Dried naturally for 3-4 weeks in the California sun, the intense heat caramelises the natural sugars in the grapes, which give the raisins their distinctive blue-black colour and rich dark flavour. Demos supply Californian Thompson seedless Raisins.

Australian Vine Fruit

The grapes are grown alongside the Murray River, which is the largest river in Australia and are dried in the Mildura area, known as the sun drenched region. The fertile soil is ideal for growing vines which are used for both wine and dried fruit.

Sultanas are graded in colour and quality with the 5 and 6 Crown Australian sultanas being regarded as one of the most premium products on the market. The fruit having an attractive, natural light amber colour, sweet flavour and juicy texture.

In the lead up to Easter, we pack and deliver over 350 tons of sultanas, currants and raisins for Hot Cross Buns alone.



Australian Raisins are known as Lexia raisins which are large sticky berries, ideal for cakes and puddings.

Dried fruit

Demos and George Harker have been importing high quality dried vine and tree fruits from around the world for a combined 280 years. Both names are well known for the supply of dried fruit in the UK and are well respected within the industry.



Vine Fruits



Our vine fruits are divided into three main types, currants, sultanas and raisins which are imported from the growing regions of Greece, Turkey, Australia, the USA and South Africa.

Tree Fruits



Our tree fruits include figs, dates, prunes and apricots. These are available whole or chopped. We also specialise in glace cherries and mixed peel as well as dried cranberries and pineapple.

We have packed traditional grains, beans and peas for many years but following recent health trends now supply the most fashionable grains used by celebrity chefs.



Grains & Seeds



Our range of different grains continues to expand and includes quinoa, couscous, bulgar wheat, pearl barley, spelt, buckwheat, chia seed, linseed and popcorn to name a few.

Chia Seed

Chia seed is a tiny seed, grown in South America, which is rich in omega 3 and fibre. It is easily added to cereals, salads, yogurts and smoothies for a healthy boost.



Quinoa

Originally grown in South America and following its increase in popularity is now also grown in parts of Europe and Britain. Quinoa is a source of protein and fibre and is an ideal substitute for rice because of its nutritional value. Great recipes include quinoa burgers and stuffed peppers.



Freekeh

Freekeh is a green grain made from young durum wheat which is roasted or smoked then polished to remove the shells. They have a rich, nutty, smoky flavour. An excellent addition to soups, stews, salads and pilafs.



Pearled Spelt

Grown in Italy, Germany and Britain, pearled spelt is a good source of fibre and protein. The nutty texture of the grain makes a really tasty risotto or can be used to add texture in salads.



Buckwheat

A conical shaped grain which is a source of protein and magnesium. Used in many recipes such as salads and porridge.



Wholewheat couscous

Is made from durum wheat semolina, which retains the bran from the wheat grain, to keep its nutritional value. Ideal for making tagines and casseroles, providing a source of fibre and protein.
